Sunday, May 8 is Mother's Day, a special day set aside on our annual calendars to honor, cherish and recognize our mothers. Anna Jarvis first suggested a national observance of an annual holiday honoring mothers because of her special love for her own mother. At a memorial service for her mother on May 10, 1908, she gave each person who attended a carnation (her mother's favorite flower). Within the next few years, the idea of a national holiday to honor our mothers gained popularity and on May 9, 1914, President Woodrow Wilson proclaimed Mother's day to be an official holiday. Since that time, the second Sunday in May has been a national holiday that we pause to celebrate the moms in our lives.

I know as we approach this holiday that there is a mix of emotions for our experiences are not all the same. For some of us, we had great mothers, and this is a day of fond memories. For others, motherhood was an unwanted accident. For others we tried and tried to have a child, but it wasn't possible, and this day comes filled with pain and heartache. For others, our relationship with our mother is strained and this day is a day full of pain. For others, our mothers have gone on to be with the Lord and this day only reminds us of our loss. If this day is hard for you, please know you are in my thoughts and my prayers. God sees your pain and wants you to know you are loved. He is with you in this time.

Yet, for all its obstacles, pitfalls, and broken dreams, when we talk about motherhood, we're talking about a beautiful idea that stems from the very heart of God. For that reason, I wanted to take this article to offer a just few thoughts on the mission of the godly mother from Proverbs 6:20-35.

- (1) The teaching of a godly mother provides guidance. Proverbs 6:22-23 speaks this way in regard to mom's instruction: "When you walk around, it will lead you. When you lie down, it will protect you. When you awake, it will occupy your attention. The commandment is a lamp and instruction a light." It's compared to the image of an oil lamp, giving off just enough light to enable us to see the next step we should take. Laura Ingalls Wilder once said: "Lessons learned at mother's knee last through life. The mother is and must be, whether she knows it or not, the greatest, strongest, and most lasting teacher her children have." In one way or another, we are all the product of our mother's teaching in life.
- (2) The teaching of a godly mother provides correction. Proverbs 6:23b says this: "Corrective teaching is the path of life." Proverbs 19:10 says: Listen to counsel and accept discipline, that you may be wise the rest of your days." The writer paints mom's teaching as a form of discipline leading to godly life. As we heed her words, we avoid the path of destruction and walk in the ways that lead to eternal life.
- (3) The teaching of a godly mother provides protection. Provers 6:24 says: Mom's teaching "guards you from the evil woman, from the flattering tongue of the foreign woman." Throughout the Bible, the wayward woman is a symbol of any alluring force that would draw us away from the things of god. But notice, God says that mom's teaching is the protective for that guards us and protects us from that evil. It's what keeps us from going astray and falling prey to the attacks of the enemy.
- (4) And that brings us to our final point: The teaching of the godly mother provides life. The mission and purpose of her instruction is to enable us to experience the life that God desires. We can either heed the instruction and experience the life God desires or we can ignore it and be swept away. The question is which path will we choose? Will we choose to listen and obey or to go our own way?


