Saying goodbye is never easy. It's even harder when it comes after just one year in ministry together. Yet, here we are. As we come to the end of this first year in ministry together, I am being reappointed.

Maybe the timing doesn't seem right, but I'm sure it didn't seem right to Israel either. Moses had led them out of Egypt. He had been with them in the desert. He had led them in difficult times. For 40 years they wandered in the wilderness. And now, just when they are on the verge of breakthrough, just as they are about to enter the Promised Land and see the promises of God fulfilled, Moses dies and Joshua has to take over. Surely, the people wondered if their new leader would be able to fill Moses' shoes. Surely, they were skeptical if they would even see the vision fulfilled. I imagine they were disillusioned and discouraged. My guess is some of you feel like that today. You were hopeful and optimistic about the future, but now I am moving on to another church; someone else is being appointed to serve here. And you wonder: What will happen next? Will we be able to go on? Will this be the end of it all?

But ministry is never about one person. One plows the ground, another plants the seed, another waters it, but God brings in harvest (1 Corinthians 3:6-8). Over the last year, our church has laid the foundation for future ministry. We established policies and procedures for effective communication. We set up a new church website and found alternative sources for income and financial stability. But most important, we began to build relationships in our community. We launched a new book club at the Reading Library, were a few non-church folk are present every week. We met our neighbors through 3 block parties. We established a welcome wagon ministry. And we showed love and appreciation to the schools and our first responders. I also challenged you to be EVERYDAY MISSIONARIES right where you live, work, and play. To get to know your neighbors and your coworkers and the people you see all around you. Impact comes as we are intentional to build relationship with others for the sake of Jesus.

I believe your best days are right around the corner. The flame is already burning bright. Hope and optimism for our future has reemerged. But it is still fragile. This transition could easily put it out, but it doesn't have too. You must be careful not to put out the fire. We are primed for greatest if we would cling to the vision, fan the flame, and step out in obedient faith to keep doing what we have been doing.

Just because the leader changes doesn't mean the vision and the direction for ministry have to change.

Don't give up. Keep pressing forward. Look toward the future with hope. Build relationships. Get to know your neighbors. And as those relationships form share faith and invite them to come to church.

As the old hymn says: "It only takes a spark to get a fire going!" So FAN THAT FLAME!!! Let that little spark rage into a roaring forest fire. Let it become the mantra for your life. Make this vision your call.

As Paul instructed Timothy in his final words before his death: "For this reason, I remind you to fan into flame the gift of God which is in you through the laying on of my hands. For God did not give us a spirit of timidity, but a spirit of power, of love, and of self-discipline. ... What you have heard from me, keep as the pattern of sound teaching, with faith and love in Jesus Christ. Guard the good deposit that was entrusted to you—guard it with the help of the Holy Spirit who lives in us" (2 Timothy 1:6-7, 13-14).

We serve a God for whom all things are truly possible! So FAN THE FLAME!!! Ignite the FIRE.

Finally, let me say this: It has been a great honor to have been your pastor this year. Thank you for the memories. Thanks for all that you have taught me. Thanks for embracing and loving me and my family. Thanks for letting us serve you and lead you. Though our time has been shorter that any of us would have imagined or hoped, do know that you are loved and that I will miss each and every one of you.
