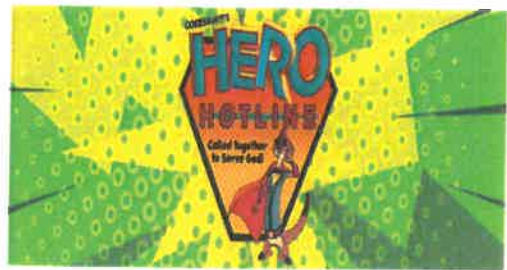

For 20 plus years, our congregation has come together for 5, sometimes 7 weeks, Monday through Saturday to successfully feed multitudes during the season of Lent. It was a tremendous effort put forth by many. We need to come together again with a tremendous effort by many to support the Spring Rummage and Bake Sale. All proceeds from this event will go directly to support the Christmas Baskets of gifts and food to those less fortunate in our Deer Park community.

This, again, will be an event that requires preparation days in advance as well as help the day of the event. There will be sign-up sheets on the bulletin board outside the office next to the Mission Center, since this event is a mission for our community.

In order for you to think about how you can help, here is a list of what is required for this event to be successful:

- \* donate your unwanted, no longer needed treasures– clothing, holiday décor, housewares, tools, sporting goods, art, books, games, toys, puzzles, etc.
- \* set up tables –rummage tables, checkout tables, bake sale tables
- \* set up clothing racks
- \* unbox/unbag donated items
- \* hang donated clothing on racks/fold and place on tables
- \* categorize items and place on appropriate tables
- \* make sure all donated small appliances/electronics are in working order
- \* make sure donated furniture has no broken, wobbly parts (fix if needed)
- \* price all items (there is a guide for this – just put on stickers)
- \* collect plastic bags (Kroger, IGA, Walgreens, Target) for shoppers
- \* get donated large bags for the “everything in the bag for \$3” sale at noon
- \* write category signs for tables
- \* tape signs to tables
- \* write poster sizes prices for items
- \* hang posters, hats and purses
- \* display art and mirrors against walls
- \* put tablecloths on bake sale and check out tables
- \* set trash can by bake sale table
- \* set 3 chairs at bake sale- 3 at checkout tables- 2 at jewelry tables

- \* be a volunteer – floor worker (folds clothing as needed, general tidying up, answers questions) (need 3 or 4)
  - cashier/checkout worker (need 2) – **Job Filled** 😊
  - bake sale worker (need 2 or 3)
  - jewelry worker (need 1)
- \*bake something yummy
- \*end of sale pack up of unsold items
- \* return clothing racks and tables to storage area
- \* set up Sunday School tables and classroom areas in Fellowship Hall
- \* remove tablecloths from all tables
- \* return chairs to fellowship hall

As you can see, this is an **ALL CHURCH** event. This is not as arduous as a fish fry week, but it is now just as important to have everyone's help. Table set up takes a day. The unboxing and unbagging of donated items, as well as categorizing and displaying, takes a minimum of 3 days. Pricing takes a minimum of a day.
