This year we are making School Kits and Period Kits (new this year) and Clean Up Items. You can pick up a list of what is needed for each kit. Look on the Missions Table in the Gathering Area for the list. Please bring in what you can and the kits can be assembled and ready by Sunday, September 10th. Period Kits are new this year and should include the following:

- 1 gallon zip lock bag
- 1 travel pack of wet wipes
- 2 - 2 oz. bottle of hand sanitizer
- 3 - 4 gallon bathroom trash bags
- 1 - bath size bar of soap
- 1 pack flushable wipes (unscented 42)
- 5 - Regular and 5 Super absorbent tampons
- 10 - Unscented long ultra thing napkins
- 6 - laundry detergent sheets

Our Kits will be collected along with many other kits from other churches in our area. Our church is once again the drop off site for this part of our district. SHOE BOX MINISTRY &
SAMARITAN'S PURSE

Christmas will be here before we know it. It is not too early to start looking for fun things to fill the shoe boxes with items for boys and girls that will bring smiles to the faces of children all over the world. There is a message of love from Jesus in each box. Look on the Mission Table in the Gathering Area to find the Shoe boxes and a list of age-appropriate items for boys and girls. Choose to fill your own box or bring your items to the church to be assembled. Our goal is to have all boxes or items to the church so they can be dedicated during the worship service on Sunday, November 12th. Melissa Dennis is spear heading this initiative. If you have questions please contact her. The following pages are information about the Shoe Box Ministry and the Festival of Sharing Kits. We have included them in the newsletter because some of you may not be able to get to church but would like to participate in these ministries.

School Kits

When we assemble a school kit we are playing a part in helping children succeed as they are recovering from a natural disaster or living in tough circumstances. We are called to do small things with great love. Please remember to send \$2 per kit to Festival of Sharing to cover the cost of processing the kits. Thank you.

SUPPLIES NEEDED:

- One pair of blunt round tipped scissors removed from the packaging
- Three 70-count bound notebooks or notebooks totaling 200-210 pages, no loose leaf or filler papers
- One 12", 30 centimeter ruler
- One hand held pencil sharpener removed from the packaging
- One large eraser, no pencil cap erasers
- Six new unsharpened pencils with erasers, packaging removed also
- One box of 24 count crayons
- We have bags for the kits – all items must be packed in those special bags

Loose school kit items may be placed in a large Zip-Lock type bag to keep them together. Remove the air, seal the bag and place inside the bags we will supply.

Clean Up Buckets

Natural disasters, forest fires, hurricanes, floods, and other natural disasters are happening more frequently. When our neighbors around the world experience these unforeseen circumstances we know we cannot make everything right, but we can do what we can. When we see the enormity of the pain and suffering in our world it sometimes causes us to think nothing we can do will ever be enough. Please do not despair; no, we cannot fix it, but we are not free to abandon it because it is so large a task. We are called to do what we can with what we have. The supplies on this list are proven needs in disaster

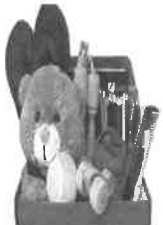
situations, please contribute as you are able, Thank you from Your Missions Board

SUPPLIES NEEDED:

- One 5-gallon bucket with resealable lid, if reused please scrub clean. Do not include a bucket that has held chemicals of any kind. No screw lids. Advertisement on the outside is acceptable.
- NEW one 4-8 ounce pump spray air freshener
- 5 scouring pads (No stainless steel or pads with soap in them, remove from packaging)
- 7 sponges, one of them large
- One scrub brush with or without handle
- 18 reusable lightweight, multipurpose dry cleaning towels. (No terry cloth, microfiber or paper towels, remove from packaging)
- One 32-64 oz. or two 25 oz bottles of liquid laundry detergent
- One 16-34 oz bottle of liquid disinfectant dish soap
- One 12-40 oz. bottle of liquid concentrate household cleaner than can be mixed with water, no spray bottles
- One package of 36-50 count clothespins
- Five N95 particulate respirator dust masks, no surgical masks
- Two pairs of heavy duty waterproof dishwashing gloves, latex free, non surgical, durable for multiuse, remove from packaging
- One pair of cotton with leather palm or all leather work gloves
- 20-28 count heavy duty contractor type 30-45 gallon trash bags on a roll and removed from packaging.
- One 6-9 oz bottle of non-aerosol insect repellent or packs of 10-20 repellent wipes acceptable. Spray bottles must have protective covers.
